The project took ten weeks longer than planned, and the final cost of the hotel was enormous.




#### SAND CASTLE SUCCESS STORY


The Journey of G & B

KR came to our program in June needing to get back on her feet, she worked diligently to find a place of her own and save her money, all while attending classes at Grace Learning Center.

DJ came to our program in May, accepted a job, saved money, attended classes and moved into his own place.

JW entered our program in early July. She attended classes, accepted a job and saved MORE than 75% of her income. She found an apartment and moved in all within 70 days of entering our program!

Congrats to ALL of them on reaching sustainable self-sufficiency!







Since its inception in early 2019, CCH's Food Rescue Initiative Program has procured and distributed 3.8 million lbs. of food;139,500 lbs. in the last 6 months alone! This nutritious food has been made available to the public, free of charge, through over 30 community partners which include food pantries and soup kitchens, as well as through mobile food events all throughout LaPorte County. Working closely with Foodbank of Northern Indiana and our generous funders, we strive to alleviate food insecurity in the county, one meal at a time.


